Sometimes my main role is doing the dishes (!) or something like contributing BBQ supplies to an effort run by Whitehorse Churches Care. I push every group I'm involved in, and they are all social purpose oriented, to be inclusive, to really listen (not pretend-listen), and to consider both present realities and future aspiration.
